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#### **US** culture

- Faculty believe in undergraduate education and will not accept faculty who don't.
- Most important aspect of a faculty member's teaching is whether he or she cares about the success of his or her students.
- Each faculty member determines his or her research area. If you are going to do world class research it needs to be research that you believe in.

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# Junior faculty development

- Courses for a junior faculty member are initially small and in the faculty members research area.
- Before tenure at least one large elementary course.
- Experienced senior faculty expected to teach the large important courses.

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# Typical faculty teaching load

- One course per semester.
- One semester teach an undergraduate course in your area but a fairly large course. This is viewed as service to department.
- The other semester teach a graduate course in your specialty. Maybe eight to ten students.
   This course is for your professional development.

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#### Teaching Evaluation

- Undergraduate student course evaluations identify outstanding teachers and very weak teachers but little else.
- Not good indicators otherwise.
- Too many other factors influence evaluations
  - Level of course
  - Required course
  - Many other factors

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# **Teaching Evaluation**

- Senior faculty member sitting in.
- Better to have senior faculty co-teaching the course.
- Talk about key ideas and how they get covered.

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#### Questions good faculty ask themselves

- Why did the students not grasp an idea that I covered?
- How can I get the idea across better?
- What are the important ideas in today's lecture?

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# Blackboard versus Power point

- If during a lecture you realize students are not understanding, with a blackboard lecture you can revise the lecture.
- The lecture can be tailored to students as you give it.
- Powerpoint you are stuck with what you prepared.

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# Admission of students

- Students are admitted to a college not a department.
- There is a common curriculum for the first year.
- Students select their major sometime during the first year after they see various possibilities.
- Student can change their college or major if they change their minds.

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# Institutions are independent

- Institutions can experiment.
- What works at one institution is adopted by other institutions.
- Institutions try to move top faculty from other institutions.
- This adjusts compensation to the quality of the individual.

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#### Little bureaucracy

- Creating a new course.
  - 15 minute discussion with department chair
- Email to administrator to get course listed.

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#### Conflict of interest policies

- Must act in students best interest.
- Cannot employ students in a company in which you have a financial interest.
- Must fill out a conflict of interest form each year.
  - Must disclose any financial interest in an organization that does business with your institution.
  - A conflict of interest is not wrong but how you handle it is important.

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# Teaching students

- Most important factor in teaching is caring about your students success.
- Understand your student's current level of knowledge and present material to build on that level.
- Encourage students to ask questions.
- Engage students outside of class in research at a level that is appropriate for their current educational level.

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# Teaching students

- Curriculum should have room for students to select some elective courses in areas that they enjoy.
- Different students have different goals in life.
- Some just want a technical education that will get them a good job.
- Others want to learn material so they can become researchers and faculty.

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# Why science in universities?

- The US science policy funds basic science in universities in order to insure a next generation of scientists.
  - Not to get the science done, but to make sure there will be a next generation of scientists.
- Science is divided into basic and applied. Both can be very fundamental.
  - Basic science selected by research investigator.
    - Carried out in universities
  - Applied science necessary for some national need.
    - Carried out in government laboratories

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# Research funding

- Depends on track record of PI and quality of proposal.
- When grant is funded you do not need to do the work proposed if you decide something else is more important.
- Research programs are audited.

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# Some Observations on education in Asia

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# Some needed changes in Asia

- Stop counting number of publications.
- Concentrate on doing high quality research and publish only when significant work has been achieved.
- Stop counting research funding obtained.
- A faculty member should only seek funding and be evaluated on whether he/she brings in funding appropriate for the type of research he/she is doing.

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- When I was hired as an assistant professor at Princeton my first publication had not yet appeared in print.
- When I became a full professor I had 10 publications.
- Today some PhD candidates have 10 publications.

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- Move to subjective standards.
  - Ask leading international researchers in a persons subarea what has he or she done, why is it important, and how has it impacted the work of others.
  - Need fair way to select those asked.
- More emphasis on evaluation of teaching.
- Leadership in recruiting top faculty and improving the department.

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 Student should be admitted to university and only after they are there for a year select their major.

 For students to do world class research, they need to be involved in a project that they believe in and are excited about. Not a project that their advisor tells them to work on.

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#### Issues in China

- Universities ranked by research funding and number of publications.
- Poor development of junior faculty.
  - Not a high concern of department chairs or administration.
  - Junior faculty often have no PhD students
  - Many junior faculty work on what senior faculty want.
     Not what excites them.
  - Not evaluated on teaching or professional reputation.

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# Drivers of world class research

- A faculty member needs to work on what he or she believes in.
- They need to be free to work several years on a project without pressure to publish or get research funding.

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# Evaluation of teaching

- Evaluation of faculty
- Evaluation of dean's and department chair's support of teaching
- Evaluation of universities teaching quality

# **Evaluation of faculty**

- Student evaluations
  - Can identify outstanding teaching and very poor teaching but not good measure.

    Too many factors influence teaching evaluations

    Required class or elective
    Level of class, advanced or freshman year
- Evaluation of a lecture by independent expert
  - Need to develop items to look at
  - Has faculty member engaged the students?
     Is faculty member well prepared?
     Are ideas clearly presented?
- Evaluation of course description Each course a faculty member teaches should have documentation as to what is
- Is course up to date?
- Ask for documentation What are key intellectuals ideas that are covered
- How is some idea covered?

# Evaluation of dean's and department chair's support of teaching

- How good is faculty teaching in unit?
- How well are good teachers compensated?
- What efforts are deans and department chairs doing to improve teaching in their unit?

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# Evaluation of universities teaching quality

- Do presidents have a commitment to quality teaching?
- How does university teaching compare to other similarly ranked universities?
- This is an important issue for the Ministry of Education. Resources to universities should depend on quality of education.

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# Faculty development

- Teaching assignment
  - One course per semester
  - One semester an undergraduate course in faculty member's area (service to department)
  - Other semester a graduate or advanced undergraduate course (faculty members professional development)
- Supervision of high quality PhD's
  - Most important factor in faculty member's development is quality of PhD's
- The development of junior faculty is important for the future of the university

# Research funding

- Funding needs to be based on quality of proposal and track record of principal investigator.
- Not on who you know.

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- Need to increase living standard for junior faculty.
- Also need to increase living standard for PhD students

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• A number of universities in China are moving from a contract system to a tenure system.

- One university claims they will reduce the size of their faculty by two and double salaries of remaining faculty.
- Need to have a strategic plan on how this will be done.

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# Talent is uniformly distributed through out the world but opportunity is not

- Asian nations need to focus on improving education if they are to become the leading world nations.
- Ultimately in the information age, the standard of level will depend on quality of education.
- Each nation should have a well thought out strategic plan to improve education.
